Fall Inquirer's Classes beginning in September

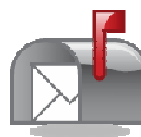

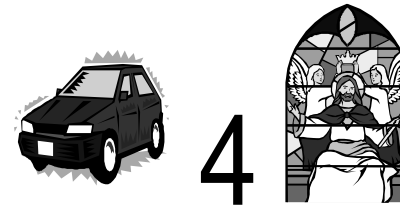

We are looking for lots of crafts and food items to be sold at the German Festival on October 6th.

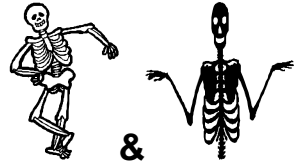

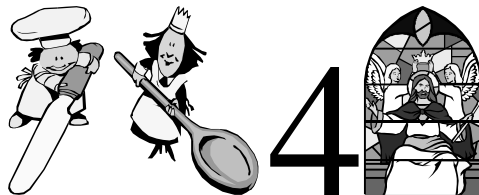

They are real people who have experienced life crises just like you might be facing today. Perhaps you have just moved and feel unconnected. Perhaps you have just gotten bad news at the doctor's office. Perhaps you are feeling like summer will never end maybe the fairy tale relationship has turned into a relationship from hell. When you have to turn to someone, call for a confidential Stephen Minister. We are waiting to be your listening ears.

This is somebody that's going to walk along beside you. They're going to hold your hand the whole way. If you want to talk with them, you can. If you just want to sit there and cry, that's fine. If you want prayer, they'll pray, but they're not going to come and hit you over the head with a Bible.

Stephen Ministry is FREE. Stephen Ministry serves people in our church-- and the community at large. Trained Stephen Ministers are paired to offer Christian support and care. All of our Stephen Ministers have over 50 hours of training in such topics as listening, feelings, assertiveness, confidentiality and ministering to people in specific situations such as childbirth, divorce, terminal illness and grief. Stephen Ministers are also trained to recognize when a care receiver's needs go beyond the care a Stephen Minister can provide, and where and how to refer the care receiver for additional care.
