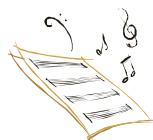

I look forward to preaching, leading worship, and officiating as well as helping with critical needs. Together, with Dr. Heather and the church council, we will seek to provide good ministry for and with St. John's.

Please trust that God is at work. The Advent season will be particularly meaningful this year as we deal with the grief of this past year, and look forward in hope. Call Process Update: GOD (Go One Direction) Forward

The interim period between the leaving of one pastor and the arrival of another gives the congregation valuable time for reassessing its mission and possibly reordering its ministry for the future. The Bishop's office of the Nebraska Synod is in partnership with St. John's during this time. The time of calling a pastor is an emotional time and requires reflection, discernment, and prayer in the life of the congregation as a whole. Prayer is the root of the process. Such prayer should be deep individual and community prayer that God would send the right pastor to this congregation. We will not be hiring a new pastor; we will be receiving a pastor based on the call from God. Therefore, we must seek God and talk to Him regularly in prayer.



The Call Process includes multiple steps. To date we have completed the following steps:

- We accepted Pastor Price's resignation
- We celebrated and praised the work of Pastor and Cathy Price
- Council hosted the exit interview with Pastor Price.
- The Nebraska Synod was contacted and provides guidance during this process.
- An interim plan is in place with Pastor Clay Skurdahl and Dr. Heather Goertz

The Next Steps: form a Call Committee and develop a Congregational Profile.

ADVENT

The season of Advent marks the beginning of the church year and comprises the four weeks before Christmas. The themes surrounding this season include Hope, Darkness and Light, Repentance, Watchfulness, Preparation, and Expectation of the living form of Christ on Christmas. The Advent Wreath was developed in Germany as a sign of the waiting and hopeful expectation of the return of our Lord Jesus Christ. The wreath, a circle, came to represent the eternal victory over death through Jesus Christ. The circle symbolizes eternal life. The evergreens were a sign of the faithfulness of God to God's people, even in death. What trees do you see enduring in the winter cold? The lighted candles were a reminder of the light of Christ brought into the world. Historically, people yearned for the sun during the dark winter season by lighting candles and fires. Christians used fire and light to represent the coming of Christ into the world. As we await Christ's coming, make time to strengthen your faith among family and friends.
